People **Testifying against all suffering and darkness, we kindle this light. Together, we proclaim to the world that, in Christ, we have hope.**

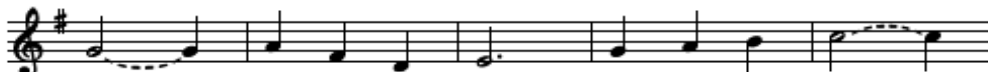



For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. 


